

## *FAST* MULTIMEDIA COMPOSITIONS : Nine Ideas.

1. **Annotate an ordinary object.** See Gustav Peebles' "A Wicked Cheat: ATMs and the Neo-Feudal Economy" (*Harper's* June 2004).
2. **Create an interactive, annotated map.** Google Maps > Create a [Custom Map](#) > Add [placemarks and search results](#) > (& images & commentary...)
3. **Crowdsource the research process.** Use SurveyMonkey & social media to create a unique inquiry and data set.
4. **Create an annotated, embeddable slide show.** Almost any photo-hosting platform allows this (see Flickr, for instance).
5. **Write a satirical news story.** See *The Onion*, "[New Report Finds Climate Change Caused by 7 Billion Key Individuals](#)" (and a zillion other examples).
6. **Create a gif essay.** See, for example, this Tumblr, "[I'm Having an Essay Crisis.](#)"
7. **Create a meme.** Look at [memegenerator.net](#) for ideas and tools.
8. **Create an infographic.** [Piktochart](#) is excellent, free, and allows students to create visually attractive graphic representations of nearly any kind of writing.
9. **Create a comic narrative or argument or annotated bibliography.** Try [StripGenerator](#) or [BitStrips](#).

Think of these tools as ways to *adapt* writing projects, *invent* materials for writing, or *reflect* on writing projects.
